Zombie Love Story "Blood Wedding" Premieres Next Week

TALE of Undead Boy Meets Undead Girl Took Three Years to Make

ARMADILLO, TX, SEPTEMBER 23 -- Armadillo filmmaker Tex Mex knew he was taking a huge chance when he quit his job at the hog slaughtering factory to make an independent movie.

"I didn't feel like I had a choice, really," said Mex. "Seeing blood all day just got me in the mood to make a zombie flick. Mex's film debut, "Blood Wedding," is the tender but horrific tale of a boy and a girl who meet after a nuclear explosion outside of Houston turns everyone in Texas into a starkraving zombies.

The movie premieres Thursday, Aug. 19 at the Trailer Park Murder Film Festival in Gainesville, Fla. The trailer can be seen at www.bloodweddingthemovie.com. It stars Rex Lexus, of "Slaymaker, the Christmas Eve Killer," and local actress Twitsy Weaver as the happy couple.

Mex resigned from his job at the Sweetmeat Slaughterhouse on Thanksgiving three years ago to start the movie. He had little background in movie-making, but teamed up with a friend, Dougie Atkinson, who had taken a screenwriting course at the community college and began writing the script.

"I just knew it had to have a lot of blood. That's what I'm good at. Dougie provided the emotional hook to the story. I think that's what most zombie movies are missing these days," Mex explained.

Mex said he was excited that his movie got selected for a film festival right off the bat. He plans to enter the film into Cannes. The film will also be available via pay-per-view on The Filmmakers Channel.
